



DIRECTORS NOTES

Two sets of twin boys, born on the same day, one set servants to the other; this setup starts Shakespeare's classic comedy of mistaken identities, *A Comedy of Errors*. But Shakespeare borrowed the plot (as he did for almost all of his plays) from another play, this one by the Roman playwright Plautus. In Shakespeare's version, the two sets of twins (who share the same names) are separated by a shipwreck when they are infants, and unknowingly end up in the same city (Ephesus). The visiting twins are from Syracuse, and they discover that Syracuse and Ephesus are on the brink of war and decide to 'fit in' and pretend to be Ephesian, not knowing that everyone there will confuse them with the actual Ephesian twins. Playwright Vicki Siegel adapted Shakespeare's tale and brought it up to date, adding music and dance to celebrate the comedy of life, as well as celebrating Shakespeare's beloved play.

When I read Vicki's musical adaptation of the play, it brought a smile to my face and warmth to my heart. I was thrilled when she asked me to direct the production of the play at Actors Ensemble of Berkeley. A workshop production had been done on the outdoor stage at the Curtain Theatre in Marin County in 2009, and now Actors Ensemble wanted to mount a full production; adding fully choreographed dances, full theater lighting, and expanding some music. Some of the set pieces (beautifully painted by Marin County artist Steve Coleman) were available, as were members of the original band, lead by Don Clark (and including Michele Delattre, Artistic Director of the Curtain.)

We started to work on the play, and just like working with the original Shakespeare, there were hidden gems inside. Certain little moments became deeper when looked at closely and worked in rehearsal. Music director Evan Alparone and choreographer Laura Wesslund came on and masterfully filled out the play with additional dance numbers and vocal harmonies. The cast came together and enthusiastically committed themselves to filling out Vicki's vision, transforming themselves into a wonderfully bonded ensemble. They embraced the material and made it their own. I have to say it was an honor and privilege working with all of them. Any magic you see on the stage tonight is because of the commitment of Evan, Laura, and this wonderful cast.

Thanks to Vicki for giving me this play full of joy and wisdom to direct, and thanks to Actors Ensemble for the resources to bring it to a full life (including the Live Oak Theater: home to Actors Ensemble of Berkeley for over 40 years!). I hope you relax, settle in, and enjoy your time in Ephesus!



- 1. Amazons, the legendary women warriors of Greek mythology, are said to be the founders of Ephesus
