In our society, the frequency of role change, the ambiguity of roles, the mutability and diversity of their definition, and our unavoidable lack of preparation breed much confusion and anxiety, a sense of discomfort and alienation. We feel unable fully to identify the self with any role. Yet when it is not bounded by status and role and firmly related to a system of expectations that gives orchestral support to its solo performance, the self is hardly identified. It may never take shape, remaining outside of its many activities, ever ready to play new roles but never fully invested in any. In the end, no self is experienced--only impersonations, pseudo-personalities which do not amount to one identifiable person.
