Stoppard reportedly said about this play, "All you need to know about Arcadia is that I was in love when I wrote it."

Apparently, his love life was very rich at the time, as his love of science, math, landscape, language, literature, longing, history and theatre (to name just a few things) came shining through in this dazzling play. So what to make of all the references? All the (at times) esoteric knowledge on display? Perhaps we could have installed supertitles above the stage with running commentary such as "Et in Arcadia ego" means "Even in Arcadia, there am I," the "I" being death (I love the 13 year old Thomasina then saying "Oh phooey to death.")

But of course, subtitles are not necessary, we don't need to know what every reference means—I could tell you what DNB stands for, but no big whoop--as Stoppard also said, a play is not a text but an event, and in this play, the event is passion in action. It is desire that drives all of the characters in this play, whether it be the "minor poet" Ezra's Chater's perhaps misguided dream of writing poesy all the way to the very young Thomasina Coverly's astonishing determination to understand the actions of "bodies in heat." The passion for knowledge, the desire to discover, the lure of seeking fame, or as we learn, the supreme value of wanting to know, all of these passions drive the multifaceted love story that is Arcadia.

So, enjoy the romance! Even if you're a rationalist at heart.
