He studied technical theater at Diablo Valley College and acting with Berkeley Repertory.

Emmy Pierce (*Ballio*) is a graduate of Amherst College and a Bay Area native. Her first role in the Little Theater was the Ghost of Christmas Past in *A 1995 Christmas Carol*. Since then, she has appeared elsewhere as Jack Worthing in *The Importance of Being Earnest*, the Big Stone in *Eurydice*, and Phaeton in *Metamorphoses*, among others.
