

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Freely adapted from **Penthesilea** by Heinrich von Kleist.

The Trojan War continues with no end in sight. First one then the other side gains a few inches, but at an enormous cost of soldiers and means. Into this stale of tortured inertia where every useless action is spent towards gaining one small victory bursts Penthesilea, the Amazon queen, breathless with rage or is it desire? "Who stands so high above me his face a blank?"

Penthesilea has just seen Achilles for the first time. He with a blank stare is nameless and without rank or importance. Whether he is a Greek or simply a man, his stare fascinates and draws her in until nothing else matters. He who the others call Achilles emerges as everything else fades for it is Achilles, the invincible, who stands above her. Penthesilea and Achilles look upon each other as if gazing into a mirror. Neither will settle for anything less than a victory and so, from the beginning, they will gain nothing but defeat. From the very first they find themselves "with their teeth at our throats." The battle may be lost but the war continues as neither one will reconcile with their own destiny.

This production focuses on desire as the constant matrix driving the action as each shared breath, touch and wound only draws both characters closer toward the other. The physicality of the production is a constant shifting and melding of battle and dance of courtship between two indomitable soldiers, the Amazon queen and the Greek demigod. The constant flow of language and dialogue between each commander and the troops ultimately melts into the sultry banter of two beings coming together. The dust and sweat fly, as do the lines between one and the other as they realize that this war is their personal battle and may only lead to the ultimate surrender of both to the other. The stage is one boundless battlefield of sand, sweat and blood with the blinding glint of armor and spear crashing together in the air like thunder and lighting.

Penthesilea is a dance, a battle, a lover's tender greeting and a fight to the death as both man and woman, demigod and queen, victor and vanquished, twist and writhe on the stage until desire ultimately consumes and devours them both.
