

When I was asked by AEB to direct a winter staged reading, my first thought was "I need to choose a script with a lot of great female roles." I would like to dedicate this show, not to the "great" women of history, but to the ordinary women like the ones in this show. Your stories are everyone's stories, and they deserve to be told. I can only hope that I will have further opportunities to help tell them.
