
Join us for our 2nd production of Summer 2017 in the fantastic John Hinkel Park Amphitheatre:

the actors to portray the title story instead.





A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

To many, the work of Bertolt Brecht can seem inaccessible, stiff, and tragic. As a politically motivated playwright, Brecht wanted his audiences to experience deep catharsis along with his characters, while remaining conscious that a play is an opportunity for social change and not, as Hamlet would say, "holding a mirror up to nature." *Chalk Circle* is more than certainly meant to give the audience perspective on what it means to be vulnerable in a time of great political uprising and violence, but there is more to it.

The story of Grusha's journey through the Caucasus Mountains (hence the name *Caucasian Chalk Circle*) to save an infant left behind by its mother paired with the story of Azdak's morally ambiguous sense of justice is, to me, an analysis of what it means to be a good hearted person in a world obsessed with the meaning of morality-be that fueled by religion, politics, or social media. While Grusha and Azdak are seen by their peers as ignorant, simple, and (in Azdak's case) drunk, their moral compasses drive the action of the play to what is, ultimately, a righteous conclusion despite their bourgeois antagonists.

Another unique characteristic of *Chalk Circle* is the juxtaposition of drama and humor. I believe that finding humor in even our darkest of times is one of our most human qualities, and this play brings that dichotomy to light. It is also something that we, as Americans, are dealing with every day as we find ourselves laughing at a misspelled Tweet the same day that we mourn our exit from the Paris Climate Agreement.

This play posits that through humor, community, and fighting for what we know in our hearts is right, we may ensure a world suitable for the next generation to inherit.

She put set design away for almost half a century to work in architecture, urban and graphic design, returning to join the incredible universe of Actors Ensemble.

Miranda Tilley. This is her first show with **AEB**. She's studying Drama at DVC. She has previously done *Circle Mirror Transformation* as Theresa, and sings with Her Majesty's Royal Opera at Dickens Fair.

This will be **Vicki Victoria's** fourth consecutive summer in Hinkel, having appeared in Inferno's *The Tempest* and **AEB/**Inferno collaborations *King Lear* and *Penthesilea*. Her favorite musicals include *South Pacific* (PCT), *Avenue Q* (TVRT, MST), *Les Miserables* (MST). Vicki is also a visual artist/photographer who resides in El Cerrito with a very patient spouse and 2.5 kids.

Matthew Weinberg is appearing in his first full production with **AEB**, although he previously appeared in their staged readings of *The Time of Your Life* and *Oscar Wilde Slept Here*, and also recently played a gay 22-year-old Montana chef in PCSF's staged reading of *Billings*.
