Lynn Nottage (born November 2, 1964) is an American playwright whose work often deals with the lives of marginalized people. She is a professor of Playwriting at Columbia University.

She was the first (and remains the only) woman to have won the <u>Pulitzer</u> <u>Prize for Drama</u> twice; the first in 2009 for <u>Ruined</u>, and the second in 2017 for <u>Sweat</u>.

Nottage was included in <u>Time</u> magazine's 100 Most Influential People in 2019.
