DIRECTORS NOTE

In 2013 Actors Ensemble of Berkeley presented *Fortinbras* as our first production in the amphitheater at John Hinkel Park and this year we planned to revisit Lee Blessing's sequel to *Hamlet* to mark our return to that park. However, as the adage goes, "Man plans and God laughs" or "The best laid plans of mice and men...". I'm sure you get the idea. So, after our producer Jerome Solberg did his magic, here we are in Kensington where our talented cast presents a play that seems to become more relevant as time passes.

According to Henri Bergson, "laughter serves a social function: its purpose is to gently but firmly correct..." This play's corrections are not always gentle, but they are always hilarious. The more absurdly anachronistic our play gets and the sillier it gets the more truth it tells. And this story is all about telling the truth. When Fortinbras posits that "...we've got to have a new story." Horatio responds, "But there is only the truth." Later when Hamlet declares that, "The story must be told." Ophelia counters with, "From whose point of view? Yours?". Is the truth absolute or is it open to interpretation? Lee Blessing's message is obvious and now when it seems that truth is constantly bent or ignored for nefarious reasons, *Fortinbras* becomes even more relevant and important than when it premiered.

We hope we can make you laugh a lot, but we also hope we can cause you to think a little about the not so gentle corrections this play makes. Thank you for supporting Actors Ensemble of Berkeley.

In Alphabetical Order

Paula Dodd Aiello (Costume Designer) has been sewing forever but she became hooked on costume design and creation in 1973 when she found herself in the magnificently populated world of the Renaissance Faire. She has worked with the wonderful folks of AE for about 10 years (for examples of her work, see www.sewbecoming.com). Fortinbras may not be pure Shakespeare, but she will never miss an opportunity to play around with ruffs, doublets, and codpieces.

Ronnie Anderson (Osric) is excited to return to the stage, after a decade long hiatus, especially with Actors Ensemble where he directed Lips Together, Teeth Apart, She Loves Me, and produced Other People's Money. Other productions he's directed include A Day in Hollywood/A Night in Ukraine, Mack & Mable, Fools, Communicating Doors, and Twelfth Night. His favorite acting roles are Charlie from The Foreigner, Jesus from Godspell, and Lord Evelyn from Anything Goes. Ronnie dedicates his performance to his mentor, the late Ralph Miller: long-time AE Board Member, true humanitarian, brilliant actor, and good friend.

Michael R Cohen (Director) has directed The Skin of Our Teeth, An Enemy of the People, Twelfth Night, Panhandle, The Talking Cure, and Fortinbras (2013) for **Actors Ensemble** and currently serves as board president. He is currently a member at large of the Ross Valley Players board where, as chair of the Ross Alternative Works (RAW) committee, he has produced, directed and designed the sets for numerous works including the critically acclaimed production of The Packrat Gene. For 25 years he served as Director of Performing Arts at Rosemead High School, a public high school east of Los Angeles. An AEA member, he was assistant stage manager for the Barn Theater in Augusta, Michigan, and stage manager for the Ensemble Studio Theater and the Bilingual Foundation of the Arts in Los Angeles.

Susan Dunn (*Props*) is excited to cross swords with other Fortinbras folks this July. She has worked in all phases of production for various Bay Area Theaters and is looking forward to performances (someday) in her favorite John Hinkel Park! Susan is on staff at Altarena Playhouse in Alameda, and has worked at Berkeley Playhouse and Hillbarn Theatre as well. Lets bring on the Bard!

This is **Mel Feder's** first endeavor as *Stage Manager* and he couldn't be more thrilled. As a recent retiree he has now found a new passion in theater. His limited experience included (a long time ago) a double

Dragonfly, a Tale of Rostam and Sohrab

by Bijan Mofid translated/adapted and directed by Zara Houshmand A collaboration with **Darvag Theatre Company**

A modernist version of the legendary tale of the great warrior Rostam and his equally valiant son Sohrab. In the fog of war, despite the protests of lovers and mothers, and embroiled in the schemes of politicians, they meet in battle, Rostam killing his son without knowing his identity until the last moment. A story of the conflict between duty and love, and the tragedy and folly of war. **Dragonfly** is the work of the great Iranian playwright Bijan Mofid, first performed just before his death in 1985, and never in this version derived from the original script in Farsi. Mofid based his play on the story of Rostam and Sohrab found in the *Shahnameh*, or *Persian Book of Kings*, the national epic of Iran completed by Ferdowsi in the 11th century.
